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PA Smart Meter Update

- PPL – Hourly integrated meters and wholesale hourly settlement completed for all customers
- PECO – Commenced system-wide deployment in March 2012, with full deployment slated for the end of 2014.
- First Energy Companies [MetEd, Penelec, Penn Power & West Penn Power] – communication network to be completed by 2016 [60,000 meter test out]; full meter deployment commences 2017, with 98.5% completion by the end of 2019.
- Duquesne Light Company – begin deployment 4th qtr. 2015, and slowly ramp up until full deployment is achieved in 2020.

PA TOU/RTP Update

Policies

- Large Customers [$>500\text{kW}$] – Hourly Price Default Service.
- Medium Customers – Effective June 1, 2015 – will also transition to Hourly Price Default Service for those with hourly integrated meters.
- Residential and Small Commercial Customers
 - Time of Use default service “opt in” option.
 - Provided via competitive retail bid process by EGSs.

PECO TOU Program

- Competitive bid process used to select Reliant as the TOU retail provider for PECO's statutory obligation to offer DS TOU option.
- Reliant will provide full customer support and project management for the TOU 1-year Pilot.*
- Pilot TOU pricing structure: on-peak hours 2-6pm, weekdays (non-holidays).
- 130,000 solicitations sent out to customer <500kw.
- 2,000-4,000 estimated customer enrollments.
- October 2013 start up of TOU Pilot; run through January 2015.
- Separate HAN Technology Plan.

* Reliant responsible for developing customer education and marketing materials, developing and hosting a pilot website, providing a customer call center, providing bill protection checks, and tracking pilot data.
