What Is the Sustainable Energy Utility?


- Clean & Affordable Energy Act (2008)
- Ratepayer-funded, privately operated
- Performance-based contract to DOEE
- Designed to help District households, businesses, and institutions save energy and money through energy efficiency and renewable energy programs.
